## Hints & Tips for Panoramic Pictures

- 1. Photoshop Elements 2 likes to call Panoramics Photomontages.
- 2. What you need: 2 or more sequential photos. *PE2* will automatically merge them together.
- 3. Works for horizontally or vertically arranged photos. Usually outdoor pictures work best, but montages are a great way to capture interior spaces also.
- 4. Works for photo collage also!
- 5. If possible, use a tripod to take your individual panoramic pictures. In any event, *don't move!*
- 6. Previsualize before shooting.
- 7. Rule of Thirds: Allow a 1/3 to ½ overlap between pictures.
- 8. As you take the original pictures, keep everything consistent between them: zoom focal length, exposure, flash, etc.
- 9. Photomontage works entirely within computer memory. You'll need lots of computer memory (RAM). Recommended: 1 GB or more.
- 10.Remember that *PE2* can't reconcile more than 120° at a time. For broader vistas, create 2 or 3 separate montages, then reconcile them together.
